**developmental disabilities**

Volunteers of America is committed to excellence in our developmental disability programs.

**Prader-Willi Syndrome**

Volunteers of America of Oklahoma is the state's leader in specialized residential care for individuals with Prader-Willi Syndrome. This genetic disorder manifests itself in compulsive eating, life threatening obesity, and mental retardation.

**Residential Care**

Volunteers of America supports people with developmental disabilities in residential settings. All of our homes are located in communities, close to family members, friends, work and recreational activities.

**Vocational Services**

A program providing community integrated employment for all individuals regardless of disability.

REBUILDING WHOLE LIVES:  
**homeless**

Thousands of homeless individuals live in Oklahoma. Since 1998, Volunteers of America of Oklahoma has been lending a hand to help break the homeless cycle and restore self-sufficiency.

**Payee Services**

It is not unusual for those living in a homeless setting to receive income from the Social Security Administration or the US Department of Veterans Affairs. Inability to manage this income occurs for a variety of reasons including mental illness and addictive behaviors.

Volunteers of America of Oklahoma's Payee Services Program assists those who are receiving regular income and need assistance to ensure their income covers their expenses, thereby keeping them out of the homeless cycle.

Thanks to the generous donations of several local foundations we were able to expand this program to serve other populations including **seniors, recently released offenders, young adults who have aged out of the foster care system, individuals with intellectual disabilities, physical disabilities and more.** This program is available in Tulsa, Oklahoma City and Muskogee.

**Permanent Supportive Housing**

As part of the Tulsa Continuum of Care network, Volunteers of America of Oklahoma assists single, homeless individuals with disabilities to obtain permanent supportive housing in their own apartment.

Offering more than a roof over their heads, our program emphasizes case management tailored to meet the needs resulting from the disability and to connect with available community resources. Although some served through the program will always need case management because of their disability, many have graduated to self-sufficiency.

LOVING AND NURTURING:  
**seniors**

Our programs promote health and independence for Oklahoma seniors.

**Advantage**

This Oklahoma City based program offers case management services to elderly persons living in their own homes and supported by Medicaid. Volunteers of America of Oklahoma case managers work with these individuals to assure their medical needs are met, and to help them to stay active in society and out of nursing homes.

**Caring Companions**

This program matches volunteers with nursing home residents who do not have any regular visitors. Nursing home administrators estimate that more than 65% of their residents have no regular visitors. Residents are often lonely and thrive on interactions with new people. Volunteers are matched one-on-one with a resident. Families are encouraged to volunteer together.

**RSVP**

Volunteers of America of Oklahoma in Muskogee coordinates a three-county RSVP Volunteer Program for persons over the age of 55. RSVP offers maximum flexibility and choice to its volunteers as it matches the personal interests and skills of older Americans with opportunities to serve their communities.

**Social Service Coordinators**

Social service coordinators work in our senior complexes dedicated to housing elderly individuals on fixed incomes. The coordinators assist residents with their needs ranging from transportation to daily medications.



**We Care Transportation**

The Muskogee based RSVP matches volunteer drivers with seniors who need transportation to critical appointments, e.g., grocery shopping, medical, pharmacy. Referrals are received from the Veterans Administration, senior housing complexes, Area on Aging and from individuals. Transportation is provided for local appointments and speciality appointments outside Muskogee.

NEVER GIVING UP:  
**veterans**

Our programs help veterans get back on their feet and into long-term housing.

**Barrier Removal and Resident Exchange Program**

In partnership with the Mental Health Association of Tulsa, the Community Service Council and Recovery Services of Oklahoma, Volunteers of America of Oklahoma will provide payee services for low-income veterans and their families in the Tulsa area.

Tulsa area residents who want to become a part of the Barrier Removal and Resident Exchange Program, individuals are encouraged to call 211 and following the referral process.

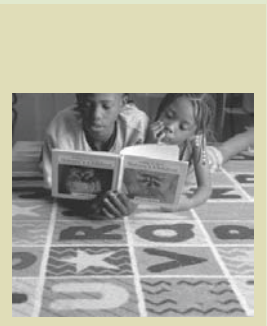
UPLIFTING AND EMPOWERING:
